Welcome to your new home!

To ensure that we can all contribute to a sustainable environment, we would like to explain to you how we sort waste in this area. By sorting your waste correctly, you will be helping us to take care of resources in a smarter way and to ensure that we all have a pleasant living environment.

How to sort your packaging

Your building has bins for food waste and other household waste, as well as for packaging made from paper, plastic, glass and metal.

To ensure the best possible sorting of our waste, it is important that you put the right packaging in the right bin regarding paper, plastic, metal and glass.

Packaging is here defined as something that has the function of containing, protecting or transporting a product.

Examples of packaging include milk cartons, washing-up liquid bottles and tin cans.

Items such as washing-up brushes, baking paper or toothbrushes are not packaging and should be put in the bin for other household waste.

To save space in the bins, it is helpful if you can flatten your paper packaging and put smaller packaging inside of larger packaging.

Please do the same with plastic packaging – this also reduces the risk of lightweight bits of plastic being blown away by the wind when the bins are emptied.













How to sort food waste

Please put your food waste in the brown paper bags especially designed for our biogas plant.

As we make biogas from our food waste, it is important not to use plastic bags as they do not decompose.

The paper bags can be obtained from many supermarkets and from the recycling room in your building.

By letting

- food waste drain properly
- using the aerated container
- by changing the bag frequently
- only filling it 3/4 full, you will avoid

the bag getting wet and breaking.

Don't you have a container? You can pick one up for free from any of our recycling centres. You can also contact your landlord for help.
